

Summer Reading for 2026–27
Grade 9

Students entering into Grade 9 must fulfill two requirements for summer reading:

- (1) each student must read the assigned two books this summer and
- (2) complete a reading journal for each book

Fiction: *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury (ISBN-13 978-1451673319)

Nonfiction: *The Hiding Place* by Corrie Ten Boom (ISBN-13 978-0800794057)

Instructions:

1. Buy or borrow a paper copy of each book using the ISBN number to make sure you get the right book.
2. Keep a reading journal. You will write a ½ page to 1 page entry for each chapter in the book. Each journal entry should include the date of your reading. You should write at least three sentences summarizing what you understood in the chapter followed by at least three sentences that include your thoughts, questions, and observations about the chapter.

Grading:

Your journals will be worth 50 points for each book. You will then use your journal to help you with an in-class assessment (test, project, or discussion) for each book in the fall.

Example of a journal entry
